PORTICO ARCHIVES

Minutes of the Portico Library Committee:

Record of William Gaskell's election to the Committee; and to the position of Chairman at the meeting on 4 January 1849, and his work in this office until 7th January 1884 when he took the chair for the last time.

His illness on 21st January and the minute recording his death dated 12th June 1884.

<u>Issue Books</u> (incomplete run)

15th April 1850 - 16th May 1855, 6th November 1857 - 22nd December 1876 Record the borrowings of Rev William Gaskell over this period.

Other Archives:

Include reports, letters, etc by William Gaskell. Details of the collection among members of the Library for money to commission a portrait and a bust of William Gaskell. The portrait was bequeathed by Miss Gaskell to the City Art Gallery and the bust remains in the Library.

Letter from Miss M E Gaskell:

dated 2nd July 1884, thanking the Committee for its sympathy on the death of her father, and for the portrait presented by the Library in 1878.

INTRODUCTION

ELIZABETH GASKELL AND HER FAMILY: A BIBLIOGRAPHY

This bibliography includes the novels, short stories and letters of Elizabeth Gaskell; and books on the lives of the Gaskells, as well as archive material relating to William Gaskell, who was Chairman of the Library, and their daughter Meta.

Students who wish to read any of the books listed should ask the library staff. Please make a note of the class mark, for example (By 148), so that the books can be quickly located.

This is one of a series of booklists being produced by the Portico Library on a variety of subjects ranging from the Lake District poets to books of Jewish interest. They have been compiled with the help of workers on the Employment Training Scheme, volunteers and students.

The Portico is a proprietary subscription library, founded in 1806. Most of its books were published in the nineteenth century and constitute an interesting and important holding.
