The lady travellers in this bibliography either went searching for adventure, or at least attempted to explore an area which was seldom visited by their contemporaries. It also includes some women who were caught up in the tumult of various wars. Those who are not included are ladies enjoying a Grand Tour of Europe; visiting a limited number of tourist attractions; or accompanying royal parties. These tend to write more of the aristocracy of their companions, and their lavish entertainments, than the country through which they travel.

Students who wish to use works listed in this bibliography should ask a member of the library staff to retrieve the books required. Please make a note of the class mark, for example (M 65), so that the books can be quickly located.

This is part of a series of booklists to be produced by the Portico Library on a variety of subjects, ranging from the Lake District Poets, to books of Jewish interest, fiction on the North West of England, the Romantic era, the history and exploration of Australia, and Local History. They have been compiled by the Manpower Services Commission Community Programme workers.

The Portico is a proprietary subscription library, founded in 1806. Most of its books were published in the nineteenth century and constitute an interesting and important holding.

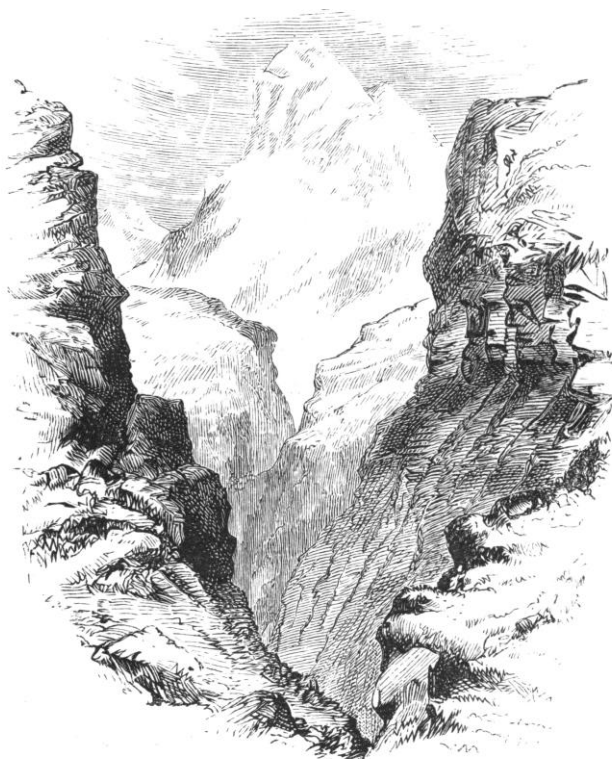
